RENEWED ENCOURAGEMENTS FOR THE EXCEPTIONAL MOBILISATION OF CAMEROONIANS FOR THE REGISTRATION ON THE ELECTORAL LISTS

Cameroonians, Cameroonians, my dear compatriots,

According to recent information, ELECAM has just announced that it has registered a little more than 7,823,000 voters, with 461,559 voters as from January 2024. This is an increase in the number of registered voters unprecedented for several years, but still very far from the real numbers of the massive registration of voters observed and the potential of the electorate of our country that, according to the unanimous opinion, is around 15 million voters.

We are now two months from the end of the annual campaign for registrations on the electoral lists for the year 2024, which is on the upcoming 31 August. Before anything, I would like to thank individually and collectively all those who have been working tirelessly since January to mobilise our citizens for their registration on the ELECAM electoral lists. Despite the many obstacles lined up on the road either within Cameroon or abroad, you have confirmed your strong desire for peaceful change and alternation through the ballot box in our country. In this way, you have avoided the regime's provocations, sometimes crude, in order to focus on what is more important, specifically the massive registrations on the electoral lists. By refusing to publish the national electoral list according to provisions of Article 80 of the Electoral Code, by multiplying illegal pretexts to discourage or stop Cameroonians from registering massively on the electoral lists, ELECAM and the CPDM regime, to which it is directly related, have sought to fail the popular revival and involvement in registration on electoral lists which grants to each one of us the power to participate, as a citizen of the Republic, in deciding upon our common future. But your exceptional mobilisation, your resilience in registration points, are clearly a worthy and sharp response to all these maneuvers. Resist! Let us resist! We must not give in to provocations or discouragement, because we shall soon be successful, as our national anthem says.

Just a few more days, let us mobilise more!

Let's go out for those lagging behind. Let us invite them to also register massively on the

electoral lists and get them to bring all those, around them, who have not yet been registered on

the electoral lists to do so before the upcoming 31 August. The more people are registered on

the electoral lists, the easier it will be for us in numbers to block the electoral coup planned by

ELECAM and the CPDM.
